PURPOSE: The Territorial ATIPP Office recognizes that the Information and Privacy

Commissioner's Review Reports often contain recommendations that serve more than solely the responding department. These notes are intended to support the responding department by discussing Government of Nunavut wide

implications and the next steps.

DATE: May 5, 2021

The Territorial ATIPP office has reviewed the Department of Community and Government Services' response to the IPC's recommendations and notes that the recommendation directly for the department has been accepted and completed.

The Territorial ATIPP Manager acknowledges and commits to reviewing the following recommendations addressed to the Department of Executive and Intergovernmental Affairs, to:

- Enhance the ATIPP policy manual's section on the anonymity of applicants
- Add a module to the ATIPP coordinator training regarding an applicant's right to anonymity
- Develop a conflict-of-interest section in the ATIPP policy manual

Implementing the above recommendations will be achieved through the ATIPP Coordinator's Committee (ACC) which typically meets once a month. The ACC is responsible for discussing issues related to ATIPP function, creating policies and procedures that support the ATIPP Act, and reviewing the administrative practices.

During the April 2021 meeting the discussion on a conflict of interest policy began. The work is on-going and will continue in tandem with revision of the applicant anonymity section of the ATIPP manual. Once near completion, the ACC will present the changes for comment to all relevant authorities, including the IPC.

Similarly, once the Territorial ATIPP Office has added a module concerning anonymity to the training and it has passed through the ACC, it will be presented to all relevant authorities for comment.
